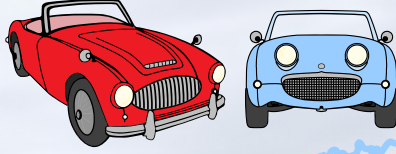

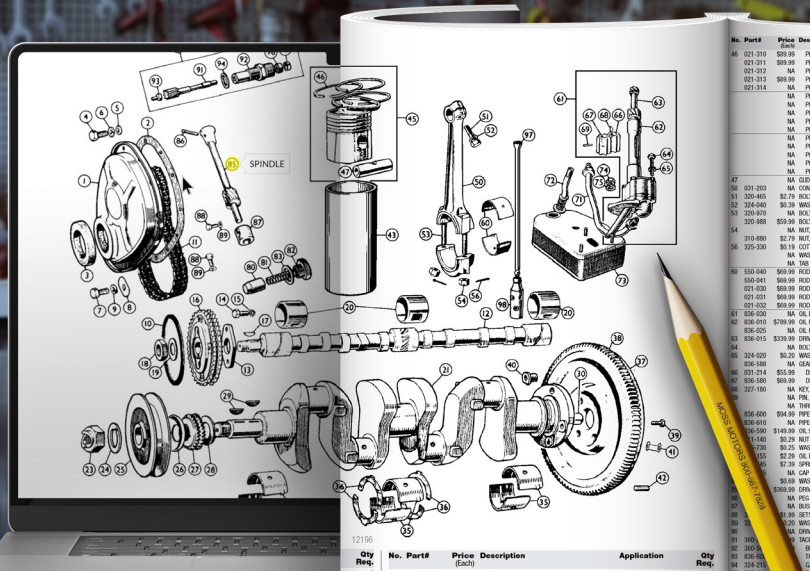

It is a short drive to the grounds of The Simsbury Historical Society. At our Popular Car Show you will be competing for class honors, and the Dominic Falconeri memorial Best of Show Award.

Tours during our Car Show at Simsbury Historical Society

1) Simsbury Historical Society will present to us a Guided Tour. The 1 hr Tour will start at **2:00 PM** and the fee is \$10 per person. The Tour Guide will take us through many of their 10 buildings, which include the transportation barn, the Meeting House, Phelps Tavern, Massacoe tribe longhouse, spear fishing diorama, and more. Sign up on site.

2) Just across the street from our Car Show at SHS, is the United Methodist Church. It is special in many ways. The church has agreed to open for us to come in and take a tour during our Car Show hours. They will have personnel to guide us. I also understand they will have tours of the bell tower and perhaps play the carillon. Listen for it.

UM Church is a brownstone British replica built with local brownstone. It has a belltower housing an amazing 55 carillon bells, a full range pipe organ and a magnificent stained glass Tiffany window as well as other stained glass.

(Be careful crossing the street)

Banquet Dinner (Simsbury Inn Laurel Ballroom) | 7:00–9:30 PM

Preceded by a **Cocktail Hour at 6:00 PM**, Thursday evening will be our **Simsbury Summit 24 Awards Banquet at 7:00 PM**. It will be followed at **9:30 PM with Hospitality** in the Hotel's Evergreen Restaurant.

Jim Begin of the New England Region of the AHCA constructed a portable track that debuted at Enclave 2015 and will be used for **Summit 2024**. The lanes will be 16.5 inches wide and 24 feet long. It will have a 5 inch high starting gate.



We have 3 classes: 4 cylinder, 6 cylinder and Popular.

Here are the basic rules for ALL VCRs.

1. *The VCR must be constructed from any 4 or 6 cylinder valve cover, although Healey or BMC valve covers or aftermarket covers are encourage.*
2. *Any style of wheel, bearing or lubrication is allowed*
3. *All motive force must be provided by gravity;*
4. *No electrical, magnetic devices or mechanical propulsion is allowed;*
5. *VCRs must run through the finish line within the marked course for a valid run;*
6. *There are no construction material or height limits on VCRs;*
7. *The VCR must fit on the starting area of the track in order to qualify to run;*
8. *Length not to exceed 28"*
9. *Wheels not to exceed 6" in diameter and placed near the 4 corners of the valve cover*
10. *Maximum weight allowed is 10 lbs.*
11. *A double-elimination system will be used for each class culminating in a runoff for the ultimate Grand Champion at the end of the races.*

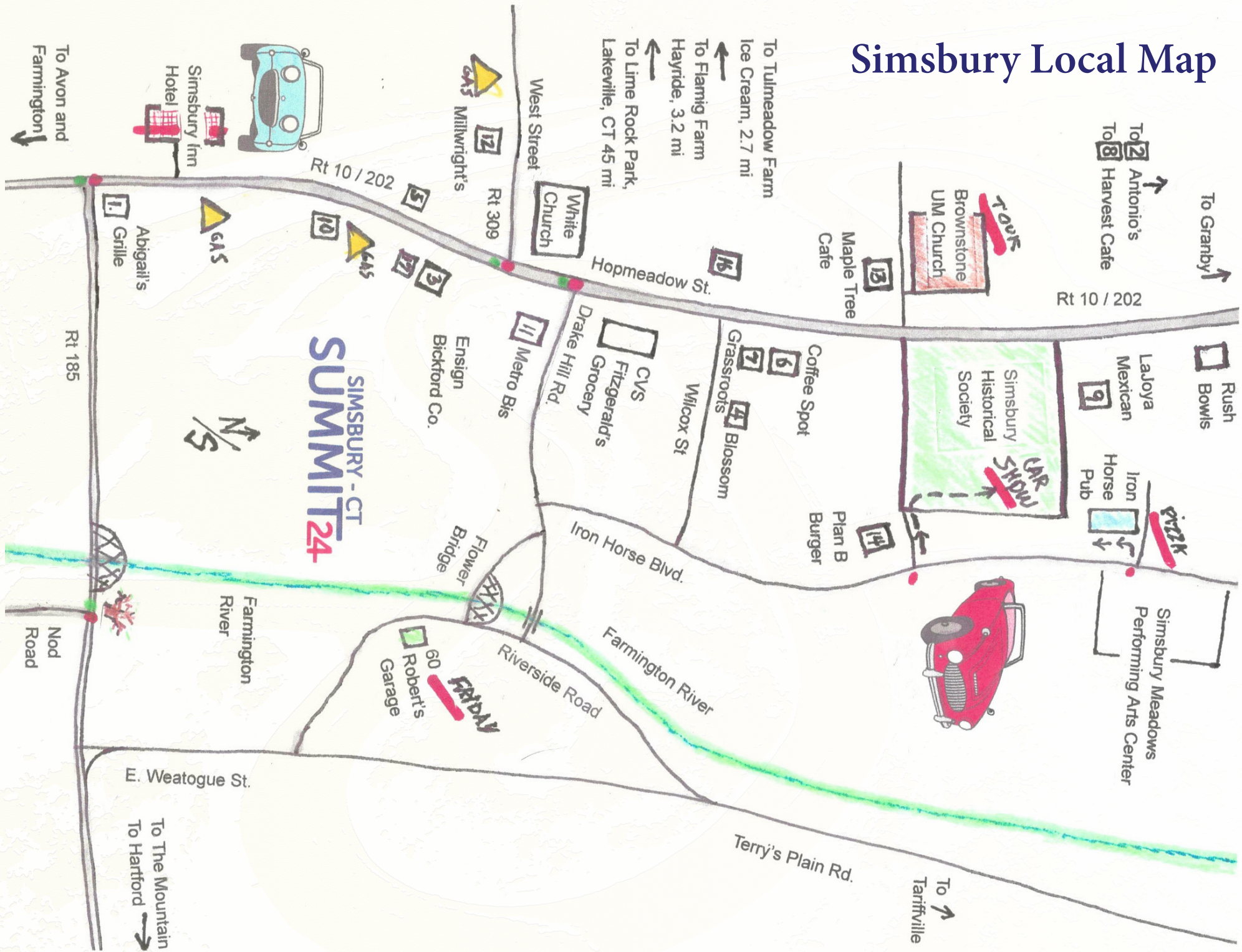

TL on Rt 10 to Drake Hill Rd, At Light, TR then TL onto Iron Horse Blvd. go to Healey Sign, TL into parking area.

To the **Simsbury Historical Society**

TL on Rt 10 to Drake Hill Rd, At Light, TR then TL onto Iron Horse Blvd. go to Healey Sign, TL into parking area.

To **Tulmeadow Farm Store, 255 Farms Village Road, West Simsbury**

TL on Rt 10 to West St (Rt 309) TL at light. at 2.7 mi Big red barns on the right, ice cream on the left Watch for Healey Sign, TL into parking area.

To **Flamig Farm, 7 Shingle Mill Road, West Simsbury**

from Tulmeadow Farm Store

TL on West St (Rt 309)
TL at W Mountain Road
At Stop Sign, TL at Sugar Loaf Cut.
Red barns on the right, EGGS backward TR on Shingle Mill Rd and TL at Healey Sign into parking area.

To **Flamig Farm, 7 Shingle Mill Road, West Simsbury**

from Simsbury Inn

TL on Rt 10 to West St (Rt 309) TL at light. at 2.8 mi TL at W Mountain Road
At Stop Sign, TL at Sugar Loaf Cut.
Red barns on the right, EGGS backward TR on Shingle Mill Rd and TL at Healey Sign into parking area.

To **Coffee and Tea at Robert's Garage, 60 Riverside Road, Simsbury**

TL on Rt 10 to Drake Hill Rd
At Light, TR onto Drake Hill Rd, go across the bridge, TR onto Riverside Rd. #60

L is left, TL turn left

R is right, TR is turn right AH is Austin Healey!

The Simsbury Inn to Lime Rock Park, 60 White Hollow Road, Lakeville CT

This is cumulative miles listed, about 45 miles total, 1 hour 15 minutes, allow 1 ½ hr.

0.0 **The Simsbury Inn, TL**, go N on Rt 10 (Hopmeadow St)

At 1.3, **TL** onto Rt 309 West St,
go 6.9 to Rt 179, **TR** onto Rt 179

Go 9.2, **TL** onto Hillcrest Dr,

At 9.9, **TL** onto Rt 318...

At 11.7 bear **R** to stay on 318w, go across the Reservoir...

*NOTE: If you don't know Barkhamsted Reservoir and Lake McDonough.... at 12.0, there is a pullover on the right, to to stop and briefly get out, then view both sides of the road, two reservoirs... **Be careful crossing the road!** Continue W on Rt 318, cross the Farmington River, follow 318 to Rt 44.*

At 14.7, **TR** onto Rt 44. Stay on Rt 44 thru Winsted...

at 23.6 *NOTE: the Wind Turbine*

Go thru Norfolk, at 28.2 *NOTE: the Historic Infinity Hall*

Stay on Rt 44, thru E Canaan.

at 35.3 **TL** onto Rt 7s

At 39.7, bear R to stay on Rt 7.

Follow Rt 7 to Rt 112, bear **R** onto Rt 112 (Lime Rock Road)

Go past the Track Office Entrance.

At 44.4 **TL** onto White Hollow Road

at the red sign **Lime Rock Park, TL** into Park.

Go straight then **L** into Entrance

Watch for AH signs, go over track bridge,
go **L** toward the track entrance.

**The Simsbury Inn to
The Hill-Stead Museum, Farmington CT**

I recommend 1 way there and another way back. Both of these ways are very scenic, and the traffic flows best when you follow this recommendation. It is 10.7 miles, 25 minutes.

TR out of **The Simsbury Inn.** mileage 0.0

Stay on Rt 10 S for 3.2 mi. to Rt 44 (West Main Street).

At the light, Go straight across Rt 44 onto Old Farms Road (right lane).

Stay on Old Farms Road to 4.8 mi, into the woods.

Follow the road around curves, past the construction, past the brick tower, (*Avon Old Farms School*)

continue left on Old Farms Road, it will curve again to the left,

At 6.6 mi, **TR** onto Tillotson Road

Follow the road past The Polo Club to Rt 4 (Farmington Ave) to 9.5 mi,

At the light, TL onto Rt 4 E.

At 10.0 mi, the 3rd light, **TR** onto Rt 10 S or Main Street.

The first light, TL onto Mountain Road, go up the hill past the Stop Sign,

At 10.7 mi, **TL** into ...

The Hill-Stead Museum, 35 Mountain Road, Farmington.

Follow the driveway past the house to the parking lot.

To Return,

Go out the same driveway you came in.

TR at exit. Go down the hill.

At the light, **TR** at Main St., go straight to light at Rt 4.

Go straight across Rt 4 onto Rt 10 N. Stay on Rt 10 for 5.5 miles to Rt 44.

At the light, Go straight across Rt 44 onto Nod Road (right lane).

Drive Nod Road for 3.2 miles to the next light.

Note: The Hublein Tower up on the Ridge...

TL at The Pinchot Sycamore, Go to the light,

TR onto Rt 10 N Hopmeadow St, go to **The Simsbury Inn** on the left.



**The Simsbury Inn to
New England Air Museum, Windsor Locks CT**

It is 11.6 miles, 25 minutes.

NOTE: The Simsbury Airport on Wolcott Road, location of The Simsbury Fly-In and Car Show. Come back to Simsbury on Sept 15th and we'll attend as a Group.

TL onto Rt 10/202 (Hopmeadow St.) North, for 4.3 mi.

TR onto Wolcott Rd.

TR onto Floydville Rd, then continue Straight onto Holcomb St.

TR onto Rt 20 E,

TL onto East St. then

TR onto Russell Rd.

TL onto Perimeter Rd,

follow to **NEAM** on the left,

36 Perimeter Road, Windsor Locks.

Return the same way or you could...

take Rt 20 W to Granby center, then

TL onto Rt 10/202 S and follow to Simsbury and The Simsbury Inn.

Historic Flower Bridge, unfortunately closed this year due to renovation.

Tulmeadow Dairy Farm, ice cream (Best Around!)

Simsbury Meadows Performance Center, summer home to The Hartford Symphony.

International Skating Center, Olympic training facility

New England Air Museum, Windsor Locks

An excellent collection of restored aircraft, and an extensive collection of engines, instruments, and artifacts, all telling the story of aviation.

Hill-stead Museum, Farmington

Awarded the best small town museum in America. With an incredible art collection, architecture, beautiful views, landscape and festivities, this is world class.

Hikes (to the Summits)

Talcott Mountain State Park, Simsbury

East of Rt 185 on the mountain ridge is the Tower Trail, a beautiful hike offering sweeping views West. Moderately steep about .75 mi one way. It's farther to the tower.

Penwood State Park, Simsbury

On the west side of Rt 185 across from the Talcott Park, this Simsbury view is a longer, more moderate hike approx. 1.5 mi one way.

Rails to Trail hike is behind town, paved and level, access via Iron Horse Blvd.

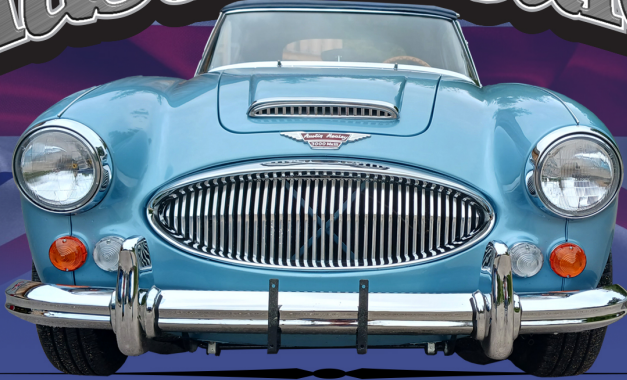
